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
## **President's Message** By Glen Morris

## How Cool are You? by Dan Alessandrini

S ince the 1980's, after my engine rebuild, I have had a cooling issue. To try and solve this issue I have installed a 4 core radiator, fan shroud, and have tried multiple fans, with no real change. It cools fine

while cruising down the road, (runs about 180° with a 160° stat) but the minute you stop and idle on a hot summer day, you can watch the Temp Gauge climb. If I got caught in a traffic jam, it would definitely over heat.



So, what to do? Well the first thing I did was blame the radiator. A 1964 non air conditioned Cutlass has a down flow radiator with the inlet and outlet on the same side. I thought the coolant flowed too fast through the radiator and did not have enough time to cool. I was wrong. If your car is cruising down the road at the proper temp (depending on your stat) you have plenty of radiator.

After talking with many members of our club and the Pontiac club, I now know this is a very common problem. I had received the answer a few years ago from working with Evans Cooling on getting the proper flow. The result of my testing is best described in the June 2011 "Ask Ray" column of Hemmings Muscle Machines. Ray Bohacz shared some more of his knowledge concerning cooling systems and specifically coolant flow. To summarize, Ray said "you want your water pump pulley to spin 1.25 to 1.50 times faster than your crankshaft pulley". This is accomplished through different pulley sizes.

### My results:

My '64 came from the factory with a 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch diameter crank pulley and a 7 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> diameter pump pulley giving you a lousy 0.86 ratio. Because the '64 used a one year only water pump, my selection of pulley's that fit was somewhat limited. I ended up with 7 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch crank and a 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch pump pulley, and a 1.16 ratio. Certainly a step in the right direction and a vast improvement at idle. It takes a longer time before the temp starts to climb, but it still does creep up somewhat and 1 would not want to get caught in a traffic jam on a hot day. The closest combo to Ray's ideal ratio that I have found to date is what came stock on my '72 Supreme with A/C. It has an 8 inch diameter crank pulley and a 6 inch diameter water pump pulley for a ratio of 1.33, this is a 3 belt pulley. Last I checked Fusick did not sell these but maybe if we ask nice? Perhaps these sizes in a 2 belt pulley would help out those with cooling issues on their 900+ point show winners? If you are going to use a 3 belt pulley you may need a long shaft water pump (Fusick sells these also). **RR**

From Hartford and points north: I-91 South to Exit 22N (Route 9 North). Follow route 9 North for 2.5 miles. Take Exit 22. At the bottom of the ramp (there will be a vacant car dealership to your left), take left onto Frontage Rd. Follow Frontage Rd to the end (approx 2/10 mi). At the traffic light, take left onto Webster Square Rd. Follow Webster Square Rd to the end (approx 3/10 mi). Take right onto Mill St. Follow Mill St (Becomes Farmington Ave) for 4/10 mi, to second traffic light. Take left onto Lower Lane. Follow Lower Lane for 4/10 mi. #228 will be the white house on the right.

From the South: Take I-91 North to Exit 22N for Route 9 North and Proceed as above.

From the East: Take I-84 West to I-91 South and proceed as above.

From the West: Take I-84 East to Exit 39A for Route 9 South. Follow Route 9 South for 7.5 Miles to Exit 23 for Christian Lane. At end of ramp take right onto Christian Lane and proceed to the second traffic light (1/2 mi). Take a left onto Farmington Ave. Follow Farmington Ave for 3/10 Mi to first traffic light. Take right onto Lower Lane for 4/10 Mi. #228 will be the white house on the right.
