

What hits, what fits...

As I discovered last month, buying new wheels and tires offers us significant choices in not only appearance, but size selection as well. In order to make sure they fit we either need to measure carefully and make a few calculations or find a very friendly tire shop that will acquire the wheels and tires you want and mount them on your car so you can see if they fit for free. Because none of

urements as shown in the illustrations of the left (drivers side) front wheel. Take the measurements on both sides, not only is it good insurance but it can also alert you to a potential frame alignment problem. If you find the measurements are taken the same way on both sides and see a substantial difference in the dimensions... get your frame checked out before you bother with wheels and tires!

To insure that the steering components (C1) have sufficient room between the edge of the rim and the tie rod ends, and to check to see if wider tires are used, the tie rods won't rub your new tires (C2), measure as shown.



the tire shops in my area are willing to order and mount tires just to see if they fit, I went with the measure and calculate method.

In order to use the same wheels front and rear, I had to make sure I chose carefully. I crawled under the front of the car and got some measurements for clearance. As we all know (hopefully), the front wheels are a bit more involved as they need to clear the frame and suspension as well as steering components both when headed straight and turning. Therefore you need to take meas-

In most cases you will be going to a larger wheel so these dimensions should just be for peace of mind.

Now you will need to get into the car and turn the wheels in both directions to measure (D) and (E). When you are doing this, remember, as in the rear the wheel travels up and down, so it is best to take the same measurements when the spring is both compressed as well as extended to the limit. This is not always possible, what I did was jack the car up using the lower control arm so

I could stuff the wheel up as far as possible, simulating full compression of the spring and took measurements at (D) and (E). Then I put it down and jacked the car up simulating full extension of the spring and took the same measurements.

Because I went to larger wheels, I was not too concerned with the clearance between the brake caliper and the wheel, but if you are using the same diameter wheel, especially if going to an aluminum wheel from the factory steel wheels, this would be another area to watch.

So, now you have all these measurements. What the heck do you do with them?


In looking at the dimensions, I determined that for my application (C1), (C2) and (F) would actually increase with the larger wheel size, so all I really had to worry about was the clearance in the wheel well [(A) and (B) from last month!] and by the frame (D) and (E) or so I thought!

I made a drawing of the wheel and tire similar to the one shown. With one drawing I took and made copies so I could fill in the dimensions for my existing wheel and tire combo and then made one for each tire and wheel combo I was considering. While it looks easy enough, there are a few things to keep in mind. To get dimensions for the tires I was considering, I went web surfing. One of the sites with the most information was for the Tire Rack. They have dozens of brands and models listed and they have good sizing charts on them as well. For example, to see the specs on BFG Radial T/A's ® the web page is; http://www.tirerack.com/tires/Spec.jsp? make=BFGoodrich&model=Radial+T%2FA The charts usually also give a recommended rim width for a particular tire.

When you get the dimensions for the tires, keep in mind that you are looking for the widest part of the tire which is usually referred to as the section width, not the thread width as that is typically narrower. Armed with the tire dimensions and your wheel choice dimensions, fill them in. This will give you a starting point to see what fits and what hits.

When you start putting dimensions down, notice that my sketch has two sets of dimensions. On the top I show the tire info from the chart. This is centered on the width of the wheel (SW/2). On the bottom, the backspacing is shown, please note that while these dimensions may be similar, they are usually not the same! Quite often there is a difference between the true centerline of the wheel and the backspacing, note this difference (G). This is especially important when you purchase wheels with increased or decreased backspacing.

The stock 7" wide wheels had 4 3/8" of backspacing, when moving up to an 8" wide wheel, they were offered in 4 1/2" and 5" backspacing. I made a drawing for each combination to determine which would work best. Next month, I'll share which I bought and why! **RR**
