Some of the points we discussed were:

PUBLICITY--Alix will handle chamber related publicity for this year's car show, and this will expand when we get to 2010.

AREA DISCOUNTS--The Chamber will organize a coupon booklet from their members which we can distribute to those attending the 2010 Nationals.

LOCAL SERVICES--Items like tour bus services, porto-johns, golf carts, local shuttle services, and security were discussed. Alix will get us info on tour bus services and she gave me several companies to follow up on the other items.

2008 DETROIT NATIONALS---We will be bringing chamber created brochures highlighting Sturbridge and the surrounding area and also a new, updated DVD of Sturbridge which we will be able to play on a lap top computer.

CRUISING—Alix will develop two or three driving tours of the surrounding countryside. This should be of interest to all who will be coming to New England in 2010 and want to experience a very beautiful part of the country we call home. As you can see, we had a great meeting.


Then it was on to the overflow hotels. One thing I found out was there's a tremendous number of hotel rooms in and around Sturbridge. A while back, Glen Morris and I received a list, from chamber president Alix McNitt, of the hotels in and around Sturbridge. We reviewed the list with our contact at the Sturbridge Host Hotel & Conference Center, Bill Trzpit. We ranked them and decided to talk to seven of them, three of which are owned by the same person. Our main criteria was that they be within one mile of the host hotel. All of them meet the criteria, with several being within walking distance. Everyone I talk to was enthusiastic, and welcomed our business in 2010. We purposely chose our 2010 Nationals dates based on the fact that it falls between two very busy times in Sturbridge. So our business will be well received. All of the hotels gave me a verbal commitment of blocks of rooms, and, of course, this will be refined as we get closer to 2010. Most of the hotels will have a price structure at or below the contracted price at the host hotel. In summary, the total block of rooms

from the overflow hotels amount to 356 rooms. This, along with the host hotel accommodations of 232 gives us 588 rooms. One of the hotels is currently negotiating to buy a currently unused hotel property within the mile range of the host hotel. If this occurs, we will have another 50 rooms in our block, which brings the grand total to 638. This works in our favor as we will be able to pick and choose which hotels we will use as overflow when the time comes. As a thought, if we go slightly over the one mile radius, we possibly could get another hundred or so rooms.

All in all it was a very productive day and it was a pleasure meeting the people who will ensure we have a successful 2010 Nationals. *RR*
